## Perspective from the Pew



I was early and decided to spend a few more minutes before Mass praying. Unfortunately, that did not happen, for something caught my eye, and I began to notice more people arriving. A great many of the people were struggling with walking into church and then getting into the pews. I reflected on this for a moment, what did these people do to cause this to happen to them.

Well, I knew some were lawyers, a few were doctors, but many were manual laborers. It seemed that those who did less physical activity most of their life, were those who were struggling the most, and those who performed more manual labor had fewer difficulties.

There is a lot to reflect upon from this observation, but I want to focus on one small piece. These men and women spent most of their lives in one profession. They learned it, grew with it, made a living by working in it and it had become a part of them. It did not matter whether they were doctors, lawyers, bricklayers, landscapers, or farmers. What mattered was they knew their profession and they knew it well. They would be the picture in a dictionary next to the title of their profession. They came to believe in it, and in themselves, their skills and abilities to do the necessary work.

Their profession became so much of them that it became something that they trusted. When times got tough, they knew their profession well enough that they could depend in it to get them through, though they may have to make adjustments, together, their work and themselves, could get through. Their "job" is what they did every day, and through their labor, they developed a relationship with their work, a relationship of trust and belief.

It was ironic that the Gospel reading that morning was from the Holy Gospel of Saint Mark, we heard "Peter began to say to him (Jesus), we have given up everything and followed you." Imagine for a moment, doing the same, giving up everything to follow Him. Everything that you know, everything that you are good at, everything that got you through life, and now waking the next morning to something completely different, something you had to learn, to become "good" at, to become comfortable with, to start over. Could we do it? Could we begin again? Would we even consider doing just that? Hard questions.

In a way, that is exactly what Jesus is asking of us. To work with Him, to become professionals in our areas of expertise of service to Him. It took many of us our lifetime to get where we are now in our

relationship with Him. Along our way, we chose not to do some of the things we probably should have been doing. We spent too much time in one area, developing those skills necessary to perfect our performance, and we did not consider the whole. Just like those who were struggling or having some difficulty getting settled into the pews, it may be because they spent much of their life sedentary, behind a desk, working long hours. While those who worked in the "manual labor" had less of a struggle because they remained active.

What I have learned is that it is never too late to get active again, to work and workout. To find the time, and use that time to develop that relationship with Jesus.
