Perspective from the Pew



Beyond the ordinary activity of demons through temptation is their *extraordinary activity*. This destructive work is more powerful and manifests itself, not only in thoughts, but also in the physical realm.

Most observers of demonic tactics agree that the following activities occur, but they sometimes differ in how they categorize the various phenomena. Here's one common way of classifying them.

Infestation

A term for demonic activity connected to a particular location or object. Witnesses in an infested house, for example, may see physical objects moving, levitating, flying through the air, or disappearing and rematerializing in other places. They may smell offensive odors or hear inexplicable noises such as crashes, laughter, or screams.

Oppression

This describes demonic attacks on a victim's exterior life; influences on their bodily health, finances, work situation, and family and other social relations. It may even include physical assaults, such as invisible blows to the body, a push out of bed or down stairs, mysterious scratches appearing on the skin. A number of Saints throughout the ages have spoken of enduring this kind of assault, St. Anthony of the Desert, Saint Teresa of Avila, Saint John Vianney.

Obsession

This refers to a more severe and relentless form of the struggle in the victim's interior life, a wrestling with disturbing thoughts planted by the Enemy. The inner torment, suffered while awake or in nightmares, becomes so intense that the sufferer may seem to be going insane. Visual and auditory hallucinations may be experienced, as well as persistent temptations to suicide.

We must note here that such symptoms may well have mental or physical causes rather than spiritual ones. That's why the Church insists that those who experience such afflictions should first approach medical professionals for help before concluding that they are under an attack by evil spirits.

Parts of our faith are a mystery, and yet we still believe. We don't have the answers, yet we still believe. Re-examine our Creed, I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth of all things *VISIBLE AND INVISIBLE*.

My brothers and sisters, if you believe in God, then you certainly must believe in Satan, and know that to be true, he (Satan) does believe in you, and will do everything he can to turn you away from God the Father.

Are the things mentioned above out of the ordinary, perhaps, but realize this, we are fighting something that is out of the ordinary, not tangible, and certainly more aggressive to get his way, than to allow us to follow God.
