Silence in Thought

I arrived early for Mass and was just sitting, listening to the quiet. I learned some time ago that God is like a gentleman. He speaks very, very quietly and rarely forces anyone to listen to Him. If we are not vigilant, we can easily mistake some other voice – or even our own voice – for His. Everything we do – from the way we eat and sleep to the way we work and pray – should be designed to help us listen.

"Are you listening to me?" "Can't you hear what I'm trying to say?"

People use these expressions all the time when they are arguing. Just think how many problems would be solved if we really did listen to one another! I learned, through experience, I should never answer a complaint without repeating it back to the person who made it. This assures the complainer that I did listen. You can't force people to listen to you, but you would be surprised how open they become once they are convinced that you are listening to them.

This is why it's important to share your spiritual journey with someone old and wise – a mentor who can help you distinguish the true voice of God from the many imposters who want to take His place. And when you meet this wise person, listen to him and you will learn patience. Finally, when you are alone, listen to God, and you will learn everything else.

I now challenge you to refrain from having the last word in your next conversation (even if it's friendly).




