I have settled myself down, waiting for Mass to begin, and suddenly as though a light switch was flipped on, my mind turned to a prayer I once said almost daily. I could not remember the order of the words, but I could remember its meaning. So, I began to go through the prayer, carefully, trying to remember the word order, carefully trying not to leave out a

It is a simple prayer, a prayer that has much meaning for all, a prayer that can be prayed by young and old alike, for though it is very simple, upon reflection it is very deep and profound. The author is Thomas Merton. He was born in Prades, Pyrenees-Orientales France on January 31, 1915. He was ordained a Trappist Monk in 1949, and he passed from this world on December 10, 1968.

I have often found much comfort in this prayer, perhaps you will also.

"My Lord God, I have no idea where I am going. I do not see the road ahead of me. I cannot know for certain where it will end. Nor do I really know myself, and the fact that I think that I am following your will does not mean that I am actually doing so. But I believe that the desire to please you does in fact please you. And I hope I have that desire in all that I am doing. I hope that I will never do anything apart from that desire. And I know that if I do this you will lead me by the right road, though I may know nothing about it. Therefore will I trust you always, though I may seem to be lost and in the shadow of death. I will not fear, for you are ever with me, and you will never leave me to face my perils alone.'


