Giving Thanks

Of all the holidays and observances through the year, I believe that Thanksgiving must be my favorite. All the other celebrations seem to have been tarnished in some way with an excess of activity or commercialism.

But this one retains its fundamental dignity. It warms the heart, looks to the Lord, and indeed is a spiritual experience.

A good part of what makes this day special is that family and friends gather together. In the rush of life the fabric of our relationships is often frayed. But getting together, relaxing, and catching up and sharing, we remember again what we most treasure in life – those other people who have walked life's road with us. We "re-member," slowly weaving the fabric of our lives back together again. We begin to feel a certain peace and wholeness, regaining our perspective and a sense of what is really important. All of this naturally leads us to turn our hearts in gratitude to God, giving Him thanks. In every sense it is a time of genuine prayer.

And with a prayer of gratitude, the proper hierarchy of the universe is slowly restored as we come to realize that God is again the Lord and center of the universe – not ourselves. We can let down our compulsion to control everything. As the poet Ralph Waldo Emerson once advised: "Adopt the pace of nature. Her secret is patience."

The act of giving thanks is truly a sacred action, a time when we realize that we are blessed by God. And to be "blessed" means to be actually touched by God. In the very gesture of giving thanks to God, God Himself reaches across and touches us. He blesses us still more!

And part of the movement of giving thanks is a call to be grateful for *everything* that has happened in our lives, both the good and the bad. And that can be an emotional challenge. As Henri Nouwen noted:

To be grateful for the good things that happen in our lives is easy, but to be grateful for all of our lives: the good as well as the bad, the moments of joy as well as the moments of sorrow, the successes as well as the failures, the rewards as well as the rejections – that requires hard spiritual work.

Still, we are only grateful people when we can say: thank you to all that has brought us to the present moment. As long as we keep dividing our lives: between events and people we would like to



remember and those we would rather forget, we cannot claim the fullness of our beings as a gift of God to be grateful for. Let's not be afraid to look at everything that has brought us to where we are now and trust that we will soon see in it the guiding hand of a loving God.

Most of us carry painful memories of being hurt in some way over the years. We have been on the receiving end of an injustice, and perhaps carry some level of bitterness in our hearts. To bring ourselves to be thankful for those experiences seems to be asking too much.

But giving thanks for everything leads us to recognize the Lord's providence – that He is looking after us in *every* circumstance in life. As Saint Paul pointed out "...that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose." (Romans 8:28, NIV)

Letting go of painful memories and even coming to give thanks for them will free us and allow us to move forward in life with our heads up.

It takes time. Perhaps you may want to think about it. In the meantime, God holds us tenderly in His hands. For that we are grateful.
