Chaplain's Reflection

Dear Fellow Knights,

St. Jean Vianney would often give a brief instruction from the Catechism at the end of Masses at his parish in Ars, France.



In a similar vein, I often welcome questions on the Faith from the congregation encouraging them to explore their faith. Recently, someone asked, "How could President Joe Biden, and Speaker Nancy Pelosi (and Senator Richard Durbin, I added), be such strong supporters of abortion, and still claim to be Catholic?"

Those individuals were once baptized Catholic and so strictly speaking are still Catholic, but their practice strays far from the standard. Rather than try to probe their motives, instead I will ask you several questions to see if you can fathom their status.

Jesus taught, "If you love me, you will keep my commandments" (John 14:15). It is obvious that these politicians do not follow the teachings of Jesus. What can you conclude?

With the arrest of Jesus, we see how the apostle Peter denied Jesus three times. Later he repented and "went out and wept bitterly" (Luke 22:62, NASB).

We all know of the apostle, Judas Iscariot, who sold the Lord for 30 pieces of silver. "When Judas, who had betrayed him, saw that Jesus was condemned, he was seized with remorse and returned the thirty pieces of silver to the chief priests and the elders. 'I have sinned,' he said, 'for I have betrayed innocent blood.' 'What is that to us?' they replied. 'That's your responsibility.' So Judas threw the money into the temple and left. Then he went away and hanged himself" (Matt. 27:3-5, NIV).

Was his greater sin not so much the betrayal, but rather the failure to repent?

Of our prominent "Catholic" politicians who betray Christ by actively supporting abortion for political gain, what is the difference between them and Judas?

What will their final state be?
