Chaplain's Reflection

Dear Fellow Knights,

"Why is there so much dissention in our country?" "Why can't we be more bi-partisan?" These are questions we so often hear.

But the answer to these questions lies <u>not</u> in some people being stubborn partisan Democrats or Republicans. It is *not political party*, but rather <u>values</u> and <u>direction</u>. You cannot go in opposite directions and end up in the same place. Our two political parties, as they currently exist, rarely find common ground.

American society worked fairly well when our fundamental values were the same, but they have long begun to diverge, and to diverge significantly.

The tension today arises between those who value freedom, and those who seek security through big government: Those who seek freedom want to preserve our constitutional system designed to promote freedom — and those who wish to fundamentally restructure our nation into an all-powerful central socialist state.

Mark Levin wrote about this in his best-selling book, *American Marxism*:

The counterrevolution to the American Revolution is in full force. And it can no longer be dismissed or ignored, for it is devouring our society and culture, swirling around our everyday lives, and ubiquitous in our politics, schools, media, and entertainment. Once a mostly unrelatable, fringe, and subterranean movement, it is here—it is everywhere. You, your children, and your grandchildren are now immersed in it, and it threatens to destroy the greatest nation ever established, along with your freedom, family, and security. Of course, the primary difference between the counterrevolution and the American Revolution is that the former seeks to destroy American society and impose autocratic rule, and the latter sought to protect American society and institute representative government. The counterrevolution or movement of which I speak is Marxism. ¹

These people have steadily progressed to undermine our society. Christopher Rufo recently wrote about how these people have been:

...Capturing the culture via infiltration of schools, universities, churches, and the media by transforming the consciousness of society."

This march through our institutions, begun a half-century ago, has now proved largely successful. Over the past two years, I've looked at the federal bureaucracy, the universities, K-12 schools, and big corporations. And what I've found is that the revolutionary ideas of the '60s have been repackaged, repurposed, and injected into American life at the institutional level.²

Their goal is to intentionally destabilize our society and take over.

Levin further states:

In America, many Marxists cloak themselves in phrases like "progressives," "Democratic Socialists," "social activists," "community activists," etc., as most Americans remain openly identifying nomenclatures, such as "Black Lives Matter" (BLM), "Antifa," "The Squad," etc. And they claim to promote "economic justice," "environmental justice," "racial equity," "gender equity," etc. They have invented new theories, like Critical Race Theory, and phrases and terminologies, linked to or fit into a Marxist construct. Moreover, they claim "the dominant culture" and capitalist system are unjust and inequitable, racist and sexist, colonialist and imperialist, materialistic and destructive of the environment. Of course, the purpose is to tear down and tear apart the nation for a thousand reasons and in a thousand ways, thereby dispiriting and demoralizing the public; undermining the citizenry's confidence in the nation's institutions, traditions, and customs; creating one calamity after another; weakening the nation from within.³

Before I close I want to point out one of the principal targets for their destruction, and that is our Catholic religion.

Marxism has always been hostile to religion. You need look only to the past in Russia, to present day China and Cuba. Imprisonment and persecution of Church leaders is rampant. Millions have been martyred. Marxism is hostile to religion because it is itself a religion, a religion of no-God, a religion of materialism. For that reason it bides no opposition and attacks all churches.

It is only a matter of time before they come for our churches and schools. Indeed it has already begun.

What can you do as a Knight? Traditionally Knights were soldiers who stood strong for the values of their church and state. Be alert. Follow political issues, and vote intelligently. Be persons of fervent and frequent prayer.

If we do not fight - we will see our nation and our lives crumble all around us. Our opponents are not nice guys. Your choice: Surrender or fight.

The revolution is well on the way.
