- CHAPLAIN'S REFLECTION...



I am moved by Rembrandt's painting of Jesus calming the storm in the Sea of Galilee. (*Mark 4:35-41*) It challenges us with Jesus's haunting question, "Why are you so afraid? Do you still have no faith?"

It sometimes frustrates us when we experience what looks lie God's "delay" in our lives. It seems that God often does not see our peril nor want to move very fast on our prayer requests. Is He asleep on the job or just not there—we grumble losing faith!

We would be wise at times like these to realize that there are many reasons that God does not move as fast as we may wish.

While he hears every prayer, what we are asking may not be in our interests. His commitment is toward giving us what is for our spiritual welfare and not necessarily what we might want. Every parent at one time or another has denied the requests of his children.

Sometimes he moves slowly because we have to grow before we can accept his gifts.

Sometimes he delays because our lives are woven into the lives of many others and what we request may not fit into the broader pattern of his all perfect design for our lives.

And at times the Lord too leaves us with a burden, a cross to carry on our journey. And he does this precisely because he loves us. As the irritation of a grain of sand is transformed into a precious pearl, so also does the carrying of our cross enable God to grace and transform our lives.

As Jesus observed, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it." (*Mark 8: 34-35*).

- KC SCHOLARSHIPS 2024-25

Council 583 will offer three \$1,000 scholarships to Quincy University for the 2024-2025 school year.

Two \$500 scholarships to Q.N.D. and two \$500 scholarships will also be awarded for each of our parochial elementary schools, St. Dominic, St. Francis, St. Peter, and Blessed Sacrament.
