- CHAPLAIN'S REFLECTION...

It is a simple and brief prayer, only 55 words in length and most Catholics know it by heart from

childhood. Jesus himself taught this prayer to his disciples. It was his instruction on how to pray and contains nearly everything we ever need. As Mother Teresa observed:

"Praying the Our Father and living it will lead us toward saintliness. The Our Father contains everything: God, ourselves, our neighbors."

We say it often, mumbling the words without much thought. And that is sad, because we often miss the treasure that we have so close to us. Perhaps is we look more closely we can see what are overlooking in our mumbling haste:

Our. Jesus stops us at the beginning and reminds us that when we pray, we must recognize one another. We do not pray "Me and my God," but rather we lift our hearts to the one who is God *of us all*. If we are to approach God should we not include one another?

Father. A father is the one who is the source of our life. The one who is our creator and who sustains and cares for each of us. The fact that God is "our" father implies that we are brothers and sisters, a very intimate relationship with the rest of the whole human race.

Who art in heaven. The place where God dwells is "heaven." And Jesus taught that his kingdom is "at hand." Does that not mean then that he is *very close to us*?

Thy kingdom come. We pray that God's reign comes to be here and now in our hearts, and that of others. His kingdom is where he reigns, where His will is done. Sadly when we approach God do we not often pray instead, "My kingdom come my will be done." Surrendering to His will helps His kingdom to come among us.

On earth as it is in heaven. Yes, God is at home in heaven but sadly sometimes not here among us on earth. As Rabbi Joshua Heschel observed:

Throughout many centuries of Jewish history the true motivation for prayer was not "the sense of being at home at the universe" but the sense of not being at home in the universe...To pray, then, means to bring God back into the world, to establish

His kingship, to let His glory prevail.

Give us this day our daily bread. Many of us grab, hold and accumulate possessions fearful of tomorrow. Jesus encourages us to trust. Did he not teach?:

Therefore do not worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear? For after all these things the Gentiles seek. For your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you. Do not worry about tomorrow; tomorrow will take care of itself. (Matthew 6:34).

And forgive us our trespasses. Yes, each of us in a sinner. If we want to be forgiven should we not forgive others?

As we forgive those who trespass against us. If we want God to forgive us should be not indeed forgive our brothers and sisters? Indeed is that not the first step in seeking forgiveness from God?

"Why do you look at the speck of sawdust in your brother's eye and pay no attention to the plank in your own eye? How can you say to your brother, 'Let me take the speck out of your eye,' when all the time there is a plank in your own eye? (Mathew 7:3-5)

And lead us not into temptation. Even Jesus was tempted. Being tempted is a fact of life. We pray that we be protected from the times of such peril.

Deliver us from evil. Evil is powerful. Only God's grace can protect us.

Amen. So be it!
