The sports bar hours will be Monday thru Friday from 4:00 p.m. till close. With this also our breakfast and chicken dinners will be done until fall.

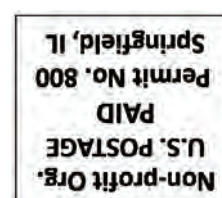
I hope everyone has a chance to come out and watch all the softball and volleyball at the club. Maybe have a cold drink as well.

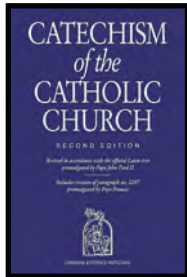

- WHAT DOES THE CHURCH TEACH?

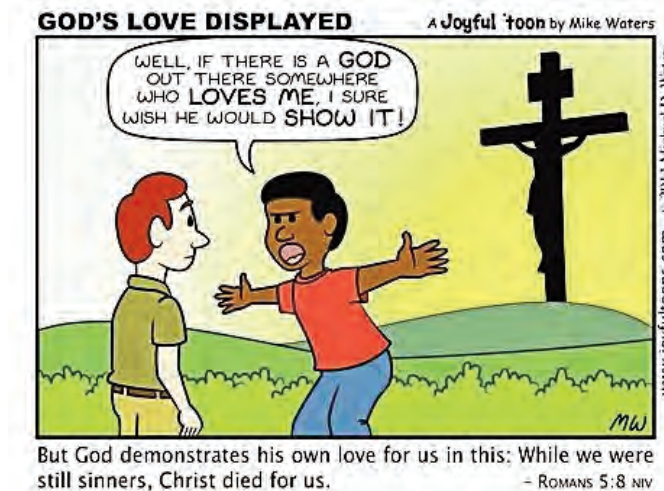

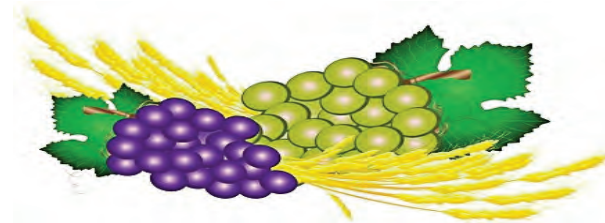

- CHAPLAIN'S REFLECTION

As we travel down life's road, we are never fully at peace, for there is often a longing for something more. While we try to fill that hole in our hearts, nothing fully satisfies us.

That longing however is the very Spirit of God gently drawing us to Himself.

Saint Augustine recognized that when he observed, "You have made us for yourself O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in thee!"

The old Baltimore Catechism echoed this truth when it teaches that, "God made us to know Him, love Him, and serve him in this world, and to be with Him in the next."

Every human being, as we go through life, is fundamentally looking for God.

We would all continue to be wandering, never quite finding the way, if it were not for Jesus Christ. He came to show us the way. Indeed He IS "the way, the truth and the life."

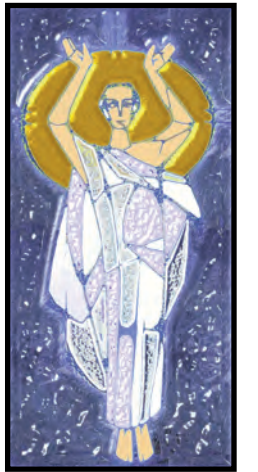
So that his truth be passed on to us, and that others may assist us in our walk, he gave us the Church, and through the Church sending his Spirit to dwell in our very hearts.

And to nourish us in the Faith, the Lord left us seven "signs" or Sacraments, that transmit His divine grace to us at the signal points of our lives: At birth (baptism); at maturity (Confirmation), at the time of love (Marriage), in spiritual hunger (the Eucharist), in our sinfulness (Confession), at the time of illness and death (Anointing), and in ministry (Holy Orders).

The Old Testament tells of the early history of his revelation to us. The New Testament tells us the dramatic story of the completion of that work in the ministry, passion, death and resurrection and ascension of Jesus Christ.

In this season we celebrate Christ's resurrection, the grand event of all Salvation history, the final triumph of Christ over sin.

God's work continues. As we have often proclaimed in the Mass, "Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again!"
